

## **Rules and guidelines for NGO's & volunteers SXM DOET 2021**

- Safety and health prevail above anything else.
- Participating NGO's and volunteers take all applicable rules and guidelines from the local government into account.
- This year we will give preference to outdoor projects.
- In case of indoor activity; this will only be approved if there is enough ventilation and space to make social distancing possible.
- No physical contact between people.
- There is always enough space to practice social distancing according to local regulations.
- Activities can be attended by the maximum amount of people as local regulations and the space allow for safe social distancing. Due to this we do not expect projects that exceed 20 volunteers.
- If anyone has health issues (colds, fevers, etc) they stay at home.
- All participants have to be registered, volunteers and ngo employees alike.
- We will encourage persons from the same household to volunteer for the same projects.
- If possible, let participants stay at one spot. Avoid moving around too much.
- Be careful with equipment, tools, tableware etc.; preferably everyone uses their own. If items are shared, clean and disinfect them first.
- Make sure there are enough masks, soap and disinfecting materials available at the location. SXM Doet will provide these items. You will also receive additional funding to buy additional protective materials – if needed.
- Projects must appoint a 'corona supervisor', someone who ensures the regulations are met and addresses other persons if they are not following the rules.
- If you can't organise a job in a safe way, don't participate as a ngo. If the local organisation in charge of Doet has doubts whether a job can be done in a safe way, they can deny participation.
- After parties are momentarily considered as too risky and therefore not allowed.
