

Rules and guidelines for NGO's & volunteers SXM DOET 2021

REVISED – May 24, 2021

Due to the rising COVID-19 numbers we are asking all organizations to re-assess if their project(s) can be executed in a safe manner on May 28 & 29. Your project has to adhere to the new guidelines below. You can also choose to postpone or cancel your project.

If you choose to postpone your project please let us know your new project date (at least a week) before you plan to execute your project and which regulations you will put in place to safely execute your project.

During May 28 & 29, due to the rising number of COVID-19 cases:

- Only outdoor projects will be allowed and there should be enough space to practice social distancing of 1.5 meters.
- The number of participants depends on the project size of your location. 1 participant is allowed per 2 M2.
- The maximum amount of external volunteers allowed per project per location no matter the size of the location is 10.
- If anyone has health issues (colds, fevers, etc) they stay at home.
- All participants have to be registered via a registration form stating name, number and email upon arrival to the project location, volunteers and NGO employees alike.
- Be careful with equipment, tools, tableware etc.; preferably everyone uses their own. If items are shared, clean and disinfect them first.
- Make sure there are enough masks and disinfecting materials available at the location. SXM DOET has also provided masks and disinfectant in your project bags. Your coaches will have additional masks if needed.
- Projects must appoint a 'COVID-19 supervisor', someone who ensures the regulations are met and addresses other persons if they are not following the rules.
- If you can't organize your project in a safe way, cancel or postpone your project. If the local organization (Be The Change / Oranje Fonds) in charge of SXM DOET has doubts whether a job can be done in a safe way, we have the right to cancel your project and request a return of funding.
- After parties are momentarily considered as too risky and therefore not allowed.
